



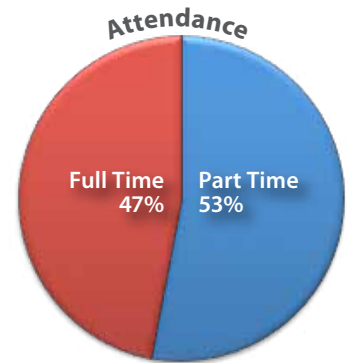
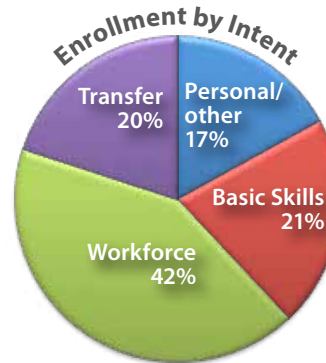

STUDENT SUCCESS AND OUTCOMES

ATTAINMENT:

- 56%** of full-time students graduate or transfer within three years; higher than the average of our peer institutions.
- 39%** graduated within three years (150% time)

EQUITABLE OUTCOMES:

- 49%** of full-time students of color graduated or transferred within three years.

total DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES: 2019

- 371 ACADEMIC DEGREES were awarded in 2012-13.
- 294 WORKFORCE DEGREES were awarded in 2012-13.
- 851 One year or less CERTIFICATES were given in 2012-13.
- 440 One year or more CERTIFICATES were given in 2012-13.
- 63 HIGH SCHOOL certificates or diplomas were given in 2012-13.

LABOR MARKET OUTCOMES:

2011 graduates earned \$46,000 one year after graduation, which is 164% of new hire wages in our district.

2006 graduates earned an annual wage of \$57,067 in the second quarter of 2012, which is approximately 225% of the workforce in our district.
