



Enology & Viticulture Program Admission Guidelines

- Step 1:** If you have never attended Walla Walla Community College, you must first apply to the college. This can be done by visiting our website at www.wwcc.edu. You can either apply online or download an application and mail it to the **Office of Admissions and Records, 500 Tausick Way, Walla Walla, WA 99362.**
- Step 2:** Have **official** transcripts from all colleges you have attended sent to the Office of Admissions and Records. (*A High School transcript is needed **only if** you have never attended college or want credit for High School Chemistry taken within the last 5 years.*)
- Step 3:** Apply for financial aid as soon as possible after January 1, 2008. Visit WWCC's financial aid website for specific instructions. Students **accepted** into the Enology & Viticulture Program will be eligible to apply for department scholarships.
- Step 4:** Submit the following directly to the Enology & Viticulture Department before the deadline of **May 30, 2008** to be considered for the Fall 2008 class:
- A current résumé -- typed
 - A typed essay, 500 words or less, covering the following areas:
 - Why you have chosen to pursue studies in Enology & Viticulture.
 - What positive attributes you bring to the Enology & Viticulture Program at WWCC.
 - What you plan to accomplish.

The following criteria will be used to select successful applicants:

1. Prior academic success **(20%)**
2. Application essay and resume **(50%)**
3. Completion of placement tests offered by WWCC's Student Development Center
 - a. English – eligible to enter ENG 101 – English Composition I **(10%)**
 - b. Math – eligible to enter MATH 095 – Intermediate Algebra *or* completion of Math 065 – Introductory Algebra with a minimum grade of 2.0 **(10%)**

Note: Placement test is not required if college transcripts showing completion of college level Math and English courses are on file with the Office of Admissions and Records.

- d. Demonstration of Chemistry competence **(10%)**
Completion of one year of high school chemistry within the last 5 years or a five credit college level introductory chemistry course. Minimum grade of 2.0.

A personal interview may be required prior to acceptance into the program. All applicants will be notified of their status (accepted or waiting list) by July 1, 2008. Upon acceptance, a \$100.00 deposit will be required. This non-refundable deposit will be applied to your fall quarter tuition.
