

CONDITIONS OF AWARD 2018/2019

Your award may consist of federal and/or state financial aid. To receive ALL financial assistance offered, you must agree to and meet the following conditions:

1. You must be enrolled in an eligible degree or certificate program; registered and attending classes at Walla Walla Community College (WWCC) during each of the quarters for which you are scheduled to receive aid. Aid will only be paid for classes that go toward your intended program of study.
 2. You must be making satisfactory academic progress in compliance with WWCC's academic progress policy www.wwcc.edu/SAP.
 3. You do not owe a repayment to any federal or state grant or scholarship nor are you in default on a state or federal loan.
 4. You must contact the financial aid office at the Walla Walla campus prior to withdrawing from any of your credits at WWCC. If you do not attend or if you withdraw from your classes, you may owe a repayment of all or part of Federal and/or State financial aid funds received. Please review the Return of Title IV policy at www.wwcc.edu/r2t4.
 5. There could be other circumstances that would require a repayment or reduction in your current award amounts.
 6. Any additional award of financial assistance (such as scholarships, other agency assistance, etc.) which exceeds \$200 that has not been included on any of your financial aid applications must be reported to the financial aid office at the time the additional award occurs. Failure to do so may cause you to be over-awarded where you may have to repay funds back to WWCC.
 7. If you have been awarded a Federal Pell Grant, you will not engage in the unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of a controlled substance during the period of enrollment covered by your Federal Pell Grant.
- The State of Washington may have offered you Washington State Aid (State Need Grant, College Bound, Passport ect) to help support your educational expenses. Please visit www.opportunitypathways.wa.gov to receive more information about financial aid, scholarships, work study, and student loans. By accepting the Washington State financial aid, you agree to the 7 conditions listed above in addition to the conditions listed below (specific to only Washington State Aid). If you have questions or find that you cannot comply with these conditions, please contact WWCC's financial aid office:
1. You must meet the requirements for WA state residency in accordance with RCW 28B.15.012.
 2. You must not be pursuing a degree in theology.
 3. If you hold a Bachelor's degree or the foreign equivalent, or in some circumstances if you are pursuing a second Associate's degree within 5 years of earning an Associate's degree, you are not eligible to receive state aid.
 4. You must meet all eligibility requirements for the state aid program(s) awarded.
 5. The offer of this financial assistance is subject to, and conditioned upon, the availability of funds. Washington Student Achievement Council (WSAC) and WWCC reserve the right to withdraw, reduce, or modify the awards due to funding limitations or due to changes in circumstances which affect your eligibility for the program(s).
 6. You can voluntarily make financial contributions to WSAC in recognition of the assistance that you received. All voluntary contributions will be used to provide financial assistance to other students. Please contact finaid@wsac.wa.gov for more information.
- If you have been awarded a Federal Work Study or State Work Study job, it means that you are eligible to earn up to that award amount offered. ***It does not guarantee you a job.*** You must contact the Financial Aid Office and /or the WorkSource office for employment opportunities. Federal Work Study or State Work Study employment is subject to cancellation or reduction in hours due to lack of state, federal or college matching funds.
- If you are borrowing a Direct Loan please note: If you are a first time borrower, we are required to hold your loan funds for 30 days at which time we will conduct grade/attendance verification. If you are not passing/attending your classes, your loans cannot be disbursed and will be cancelled. Beginning Fall of 2013, Subsidized Direct Loan amounts are limited based on your program of study and your percentage of completion within that program. More details are provided in the loan entrance counseling on www.studentloans.gov. If you have completed this counseling prior to Fall of 2013 it is advisable to go to this website to get the most current information regarding your loan eligibility.

The financial aid award offered is for the 2018-2019 school year only. Renewal of aid in subsequent years is based on eligibility by completing a new Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). New applications for 2019-2020 school year will be available beginning October 1, 2018 at www.fafsa.ed.gov.
