

# 2021/2022 FINANCIAL AID DEADLINES

In order to receive financial aid funds by the quarter you intend to enroll, please use the following deadlines to have all of your paperwork turned in and complete. If you meet this deadline, then funds will be in place for you to begin that quarter. If you do not meet this deadline you can still enroll for that quarter, but please make sure to have other sources to pay your tuition, fees and books until your financial aid is processed.

FAFSA Priority Deadline*	<b>March 1, 2021</b>
Fall Quarter Deadline**	<b>May 3, 2021</b>
Winter Quarter Deadline	<b>November 1, 2021</b>
Spring Quarter Deadline	<b>February 3, 2022</b>
Summer Quarter Deadline	<b>May 1, 2022</b>

\* Students who have successfully submitted a completed FAFSA to WWCC by this deadline will receive maximum consideration for funds with limited availability assuming they have all other paperwork submitted by May 3.

\*\* The WASFA (for non-citizen students who meet the Washington State Need Grant program's income and residency requirements) must be completed by this deadline in order to be considered for any available state funding.

Financial aid notifications are mailed to the address provided on your FAFSA in addition to being listed on the portal. Please make sure your address is updated with the Office of Admissions and on your FAFSA.*
