



Sexual Misconduct and Title IX

Remedies, Safety Measures and Support Services

In response to a report of alleged sexual misconduct, sexual and or gender-based harassment, sex discrimination or sexual violence, including sexual assault, intimate partner violence (domestic violence and dating violence), stalking and retaliation for the reporting of such conduct, Walla Walla Community College (College) offers various remedies, safety measures, and/or confidential support services to both the responding and reporting parties which are designed to immediately stop the current behaviors as well as prevent any further behaviors and actions which could affect either parties' access to the college's educational, employment and co-curricular programs, services and activities. These measures and support services can often be put in place very quickly, even prior to the resolution of any report or investigation. Equally important, these measures and support services are available regardless of whether an investigation or formal conduct action occurs.

The Title IX Coordinator or designee will make every reasonable effort to communicate with the appropriate parties to ensure all safety, emotional and physical welfare concerns are being addressed throughout the process. The Title IX Coordinator or designee will provide the responding party and reporting party and/or the parties' counselor or advocate, in writing, with a list of remedies, safety measures and support options available through the college, local community, and/or statewide and national agencies.

The Title IX Coordinator or designee will work with the responding and reporting parties and/or their counselors or advocates to identify and determine the most appropriate remedies, safety measures and support services given the circumstances of the incident(s). Examples of immediate, interim, short-term and on-going support measures include, but are not limited to:

- **Confidential Counseling** and mental health support services through on-campus counseling and/or local counseling or advocacy services (see reverse for support resources).
- **No Contact** directives, which serves as notice to both parties they must not have any form of communications, including verbal, non-verbal, electronic, written, or via third party, with each other.
- **Campus Access Restriction**, which limits access to campus or to specific rooms, offices, campus facilities, or campus areas.
- **Academic Accommodations**, which may include rescheduling an examination or academic assignment, transfer to another class/lab section or online, extended time on assignments due, tutoring support, withdrawal from class without academic or financial aid based penalties, arranging for incompletes or withdrawal from the quarter.
- **Security Assistance** or escort services on campus to ensure the student can move safely between classes, programs and activities.
- **Employment Accommodations** of on-campus work schedule or job assignment.
- **Interim College Removal**, which is the interim withdrawal of the either or both parties from college premises pending resolution of the matter.
- **Other Reporting** options, which include providing information on reporting the incident(s) to a law enforcement agency for criminal/legal action outside of the college process (see reverse side).
- **Other Remedies** or accommodations to ensure the safety and well-being of the parties.
