

**Addendum to WWCC Phase 2 Re-entry Plan for  
CPR/BLS and AHA Heartsaver First Aid, Summer 2020**

The CPR/BLS and AHA Heartsaver First Aid classes will abide by all requirements in “Phase 2 Higher Education & Workforce Training COVID-19 Requirements” from Washington State (Governor Inslee) and WWCC Phase 2 Exposure Control, Mitigation, and Recovery Plan “Phase 2 Re-entry Plan.”

In Summer quarter, 2020, the CPR/BLS and AHA Heartsaver First Aid classes anticipates offering CPR 051 and Heartsaver First Aid IFA 022 (.4 credits) on both the Walla Walla and Clarkston campuses.

- The CPR/BLS (5 hours = .4 credits) and AHA Heartsaver First Aid (6 hours = .4) classes will be held on campus.
  - Most skills can be done with 6-foot physical distancing
  - Certain skills will require closer than 6-feet, either student/faculty or student/student

The information in this addendum is specific to the CPR/BLS and AHA Heartsaver First Aid classes that will be held on both the Walla Walla and Clarkston campuses this summer.

**Physical Distancing**

Informing Employees and Students of Physical Distancing:

- The site supervisor (instructor) will review this requirement at Day 1 on-site orientation. The class will be conducted with 6 feet distancing and facial coverings except where otherwise noted below.
- A door for entry will be identified for students. They will be checked in by the instructor while observing 6 feet distancing.

Preventing Gatherings of Students and Maintaining 6-Foot Physical Distancing:

- Students will be allowed a break after each hour during the class
- Breaks and restroom trips will be staggered to prevent gatherings
- As weather permits, students will be encouraged to take breaks outside

Identified "Choke" Points and High-Risk Areas for Congregation:

- Restrooms (will allow one student at a time)
- Sink areas: Walla Walla - 4 students to room 1835 and 4 students staggered to restroom.  
Clarkston: 1 person at a time will wash hands in restroom (must remain 6 feet from the person ahead of you; sinks are outlined in the campus maps in the appendices)

Steps Taken to Minimize Interactions During Class Activities and Ensure 6-Foot Physical Distancing:

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Nursing Education

- In Walla Walla, students attending the BLS/CPR class will enter through the doors as follows after they are checked in by the class site supervisor (instructor):
  - For room 1836, enter through the farthest east single door at the base of the stairs by the skills lab; progress directly upstairs to room 1836
  - Clarkston will enter the north door and exit the west door
- Each student is assigned a mannequin where they will remain in their “6 feet bubble”
- Supplies needed for the class will be placed on a table at the rear of the classroom by the instructor prior to class.
- If a student needs a chair, one will be provided in their space

Scheduling of Students to Minimize Interactions:

- Students have been scheduled in their CPR/BLS groups of 8 students per class.
- The last 15 minutes of each class is reserved for doing cleaning and sanitization the space where they were assigned

**Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)**

PPE Appropriate for BLS/CPR and 1<sup>st</sup> Aid classes > 6-Foot Physical Distancing:

- Students, faculty, and staff will wear face coverings/masks during the class.
  - They will be encouraged to bring their own face covering; if they do not have one, a disposable mask will be provided
- Students, faculty, and staff will do an initial handwashing upon entry into the back room and use hand sanitizer or wash hands hourly while in the class
- Students will wear their face covering and disposable gloves to do cleaning/sanitizing

PPE Appropriate for BLS/CPR and 1<sup>st</sup> Aid classes Activities < 6-Foot Physical Distancing:

For the limited number of skills that require a student to pair with another student to perform the skill (list of these skills below), students will do the following prior to beginning the activity with < 6 feet distancing:

- Adult AED CPR two person
- Adult CPR – Bag mask ventilation – two person
- Infant CPR – Bag mask ventilation – two person

After these skills have been performed by the student pairs, they will take off the disposable gowns/gloves, complete hand hygiene, and don their personal face covering.

## Sanitization and Cleanliness

### Handwashing with Soap and Running Water:

- Students will be directed to the restrooms one at a time for handwashing.
- Students will do a 20 second handwash upon arrival and at the end of class when leaving
- If a student leaves the class for a restroom or other break, they will do a 20 second handwash before returning to the class.

### Use of Hand Sanitizer:

- There will be hand sanitizer provided.
- Students will be instructed to use hand sanitizer at least hourly while in the class

### Signage for Proper Hygiene:

### Cleaning and Disinfecting of Worksite and High Touch Surfaces/Tools/Equipment:

- Instructor announces the opening and closing cleaning and disinfecting procedure for students to complete each class session as part of the class
- Cleaning supplies will be available at the entrance of the classroom
- All class equipment (mannequins, and AED, Bag masks) used during the session will be disinfected between students and at end of class session. The students will disinfect the outside surfaces of their own mannequin. The instructor will be responsible for changing the lungs.
- High touch surfaces including table-tops, door handles, light switches, countertops, handles, desks, phones, keyboards faucets, sinks, and hard surfaces on beds will be disinfected after each class session.
- Visibly dirty surfaces will be cleaned with soap and water prior to disinfecting.
- There will be a minimum of 24 hours between class sessions to ensure that disinfectant solution has had ample time to work.

### Disinfecting an Area of an Employee Who Feels Sick and Goes Home:

The area will be cordoned off until WWCC Facilities staff can deep clean/disinfect
