Open Doors

Open Doors provides Washington students an educational opportunity outside the traditional high school setting. It is designed to allow students that are credit deficient or have dropped out of high school an opportunity to earn their diploma or GED® within the college setting. Students between 16 and 21 years of age who have not earned a high school diploma may be eligible to participate to earn a high school diploma, work toward a GED®, or even complete an AA or other college program.
