RE: **Correction of WWCC Nursing Student Handbook, 2024-25**, regarding the need for students to achieve an ATI Level 2 Proficiency Score on ATI exams

Dear Nursing Students,

It came to our attention that there is conflicting information in the 2024-25 WWCC Nursing Student Handbook regarding students obtaining an ATI Level 2 Proficiency Score on ATI exams. The **correct** information is stated on p. 28:

“Standardized Tests

Standardized testing for nursing, in the form of Assessment Technologies Institute (ATI) tests, will be given throughout the program. Students have the option to remediate and take a **retake** test at a pre-scheduled time. If a student chooses to retake an ATI proctored test, the higher of the two tests will count toward the final grade. A testing fee is assessed each quarter that includes 2 attempts at each ATI test. See the list of Tuition and Fees in the Nursing Program Admission Guide for the fee amount per quarter.”

This information did not get updated on the ATI “FAQ” sheet on p. 69 in the appendices (it says that students who do not obtain an ATI Level 2 Proficiency Score are required to remediate and retake the failed ATI test one time and this is not correct).

I am sorry for any confusion that this may have caused.
