NURSING PROGRAM COMPLETION RATE: Generic Program Option

NEW 2023 ACEN Accreditation Standard 5.2- The faculty will:

- calculate the on-time program completion rate for each program option from the first nursing course through completion of the courses required for conferral of a certificate, diploma, or degree;
- establish a specific, measurable expected level of achievement outcome statement for on-time program completion for each program option and provide a rationale for each expected level of achievement;
- collect aggregate program completion rate data annually and disaggregate the data to promote meaningful analysis; provide justification for data that are not disaggregated;
- analyze program completion rate data (aggregate and/or disaggregate) annually and when necessary, implement actions based on the analysis to maintain and/or improve program completion rate;
- maintain documentation for the three most recent years of the data (aggregate and/or disaggregate), the analysis of data, and the use of data analysis in program decision-making to maintain and/or improve students' success in completing the program; and
- share the analysis of the program completion rate data with communities of interest.

WWCC Expected Outcomes for the two Program Entry Options:

Generic Entry: Seventy percent (70%) or more of students will earn an associate level degree in nursing within two years (six quarters) of enrollment in the first nursing course.

LPN Advanced Entry: Seventy percent (70%) or more of the students will earn an associate level degree in nursing 5 quarters (if LPN enters in Winter, first-year) or 4 quarters (if LPN enters in Spring, first-year).

Because many of the students in the WWCC nursing program often have socioeconomic issues that cause them to stop out of the program for one year, the program also tracks completions for 150% program length (three years). This is not required by ACEN.

- Summer 2018 was the last time that the WA State Board of Nursing allowed WWCC to offer a 12-credit LPN to ADN transition course. Without that, LPN completions have decreased below the 70% threshold.
- In Walla Walla, the two LPNs who were unsuccessful over the past five years withdrew during their quarter of entry and did not return to complete their studies.
- In Clarkston, six LPNs were unsuccessful at 100% completion over the past five years. Of these, one received a "Z" grade (extenuating circumstances) their quarter of entry, two withdrew during their quarter of entry, two were successful in first-year but failed in Fall quarter, second-year nursing, and one LPNs completed in 150% time.

PASS RATE ON THE NCLEX-RN

NEW 2023 ACEN Accreditation Standard 5.3-The most recent annual pass rate OR the mean pass rate for three most recent years must meet at least one of the following based on the total number of test-takers:

- 80% or greater for all first-time test-takers; or
- 80% or greater for all first-time test-takers and repeaters; or
- at or above the national/territorial mean based on the nursing program type.

WWCC Expected Outcome: The program's most recent annual licensure examination pass rate will be at least 80% for all first-time test takers during the same 12-month period.

WWCC Expected Outcome: Ninety percent (90%) of the nursing graduates who responded to the Nursing Graduate Survey will report being employed in nursing 6-12 months after graduation.

CONTINUING NURSING EDUCATION RATES

This Outcome was changed from 30% to 40% in 2021 because 30% was consistently being met.

WWCC Expected Outcome: Forty percent (40%) of the nursing graduates who responded to the Nursing Graduate Survey will report being admitted to or having completed a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree at 6-12 months after graduation.

WWCC Expected Outcome: Ninety percent (90%) of the nursing graduates who responded to the Nursing Graduate Survey will rate their Overall Nursing Program Satisfaction at ≥ 3 (Satisfied) on a 1-4 point scale.

(4 = Highly satisfied, 3 = Satisfied, 2 = Dissatisfied, 1 = Highly dissatisfied)
