WHAT IS VETERIANARIAN TECHNOLOGY?

The veterinary technician is an essential member veterinary health care team. They have been educated in the care and handling of animals, the basic principles of normal and abnormal life processes, and in many laboratory and clinical procedures.

WHAT DEGREE DO I GET AT WWCC?
