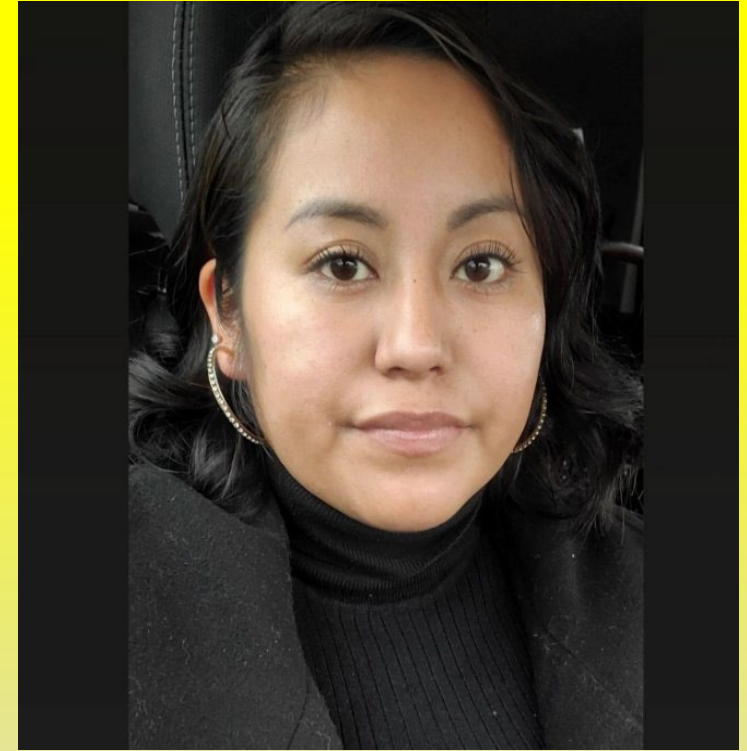

Walla Walla Community College Timeline

1973 College Logo unveiled.

1967

The firm hands of Dr. Einar Dieblich guided Walla Walla Community College through tumultuous times and seas of confusion to a successful opening Sept. 19, 1967.

The campus was located in the old Walla Walla High School buildings at 340 S. Park Street. Enrollment was 850 students and tuition was \$70.00 per quarter.

1973-74 The main building was constructed in 1973 and in the fall of 1974 classes were started on the new campus. The Forster building, Parent Child Center and greenhouses were added in 1975.



1977 The unique geodesic dome structure topped with 1,000 gold anodized aluminum panels was completed and dedicated in October to Dr. Dieblich, the first president of the college. The China Pavilion and this glass replica were gifts from the Peoples Republic of China.



1979 The Ag Mechanics building opened in September. The Men's basketball team won the NWAACC Championship in 1978 and 1979. The men's football team won AACCC championships in 1979 and 1981.

1981

"Oklahoma!" was the first summer musical produced by the WWCC Foundation for student scholarships.



1982 Wayland DeWitt becomes the second President of the College.

1983

Secretary of the Interior James Watt personally awarded a National Award for Irrigation Technology.



1984 Dr. Steven VanAssche becomes the third President of the College. He had served as a Vice President and as Academic Dean.



1988 The new Clarkson Center opened.



1991 The Technology Center opened in September.

1992

The Women's RoboCup team won the NIRA Championship.



1993 The College Logo was first used.

2001

The Women's Basketball team won the NWAACC Championship. The Men's Golf team won the NWAACC Championship in 2003, 2004, 2006, 2007 and 2008.



2003 The Entology and Viticulture Center opened in September, with students from around the county coming to learn the art and science of making wine.



2007 The Health Science Center and the William Grant Walter & Environmental Center opened in September as well as a major addition to the Health building on the Walla Walla Campus. The Health Science Center also opened on the Clarkson campus.



2009 The Women's Soccer team won the NWAACC Championships in 2009, 2010 and 2011.

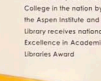

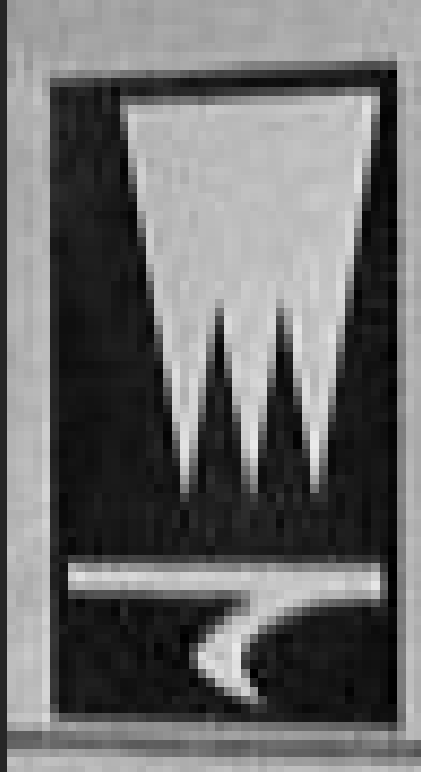
